Sunday – Commence the Mission Week at 10:30am Mass, Mater Christi Parish. Entry of St Hilarion Relic into Mater Christi Parish.

Monday & Tuesday - Mission Mass, Scalabrini Chapel, The House of St Hilarion, Seaton at 7.00pm.

Wednesday to Friday - Mission Mass, Mater Christi Parish at 7.00pm.

Saturday - Mass commencing at 7.30pm at Mater Christi Parish followed by candlelit procession.

This year will be the 58th staging of our much loved Feast Day of St Hilarion. It promises to be exciting and appealing to people of ages, with a diverse range of entertainment, attractions, food stalls, special guests, sideshows, fun and games.

Religious Preparations

While the Feast Day is the highest profile event in this important period, we should not lose sight of the religious preparations in the preceding week which will take place at Mater Christi Parish and the Scalabrini Chapel in the House of St Hilarion.

This year's Feast theme is a **Faith, Hope & Charity**. We in Australia have felt the economic and social pressures being faced across the world this past year. On a global scale however, our predicament is not as severe as that faced by many, most obviously seen in the desperation of refugees clinging to rickety old boats from desperate circumstances in war torn areas such as Afghanistan. In times like these, the old saying of Faith, Hope and Charity really does have true meaning, and during our religious preparations we invite you to explore your conscience and question your own feelings.

Certainly if one draws on the example of our Patron Saint and the teachings of Jesus Christ, faith, hope and charity should be deeply entrenched in our thinking and perhaps most importantly, in the daily way in which we lead our lives.

The Feast Day

Sunday 21 October will be a fantastic day of entertainment for all ages. The day starts at 10.00am with a procession from the Mater Christi Church, and followed by Mass which will be celebrated by Fr Emilio and the Mater Christi Choir.

Saint Hilarion Hosts Major Aged Care Conference

Reflecting its position as a respected service provider in the South Australian aged care industry, Saint Hilarion recently hosted a major forum for 100 aged care and allied health providers in cooperation with the industry peak body, Aged and Community Services SA/NT Inc.

Aged care professionals from across metropolitan and country areas came to the House of Saint Hilarion at Seaton where the theme of the day was *Inspiring our Workforce to Transform our Visions into Reality*. The theme reflected one of the key challenges facing the expanding aged care sector: ensuring a high quality, suitably trained workforce into the future.

Featuring 12 different presenters, the conference recognised that the Aged Care industry is going through an important change across Australia, where service provision is moving from a more conservative model of care (only) to a new model focused on all aspects of the resident's life.

While good quality care will remain at the forefront, this more holistic approach recognises other key aspects important to resident wellbeing, including community interaction, lifestyle choices and greater independence in decision making. This necessitates important changes in recruitment policies and workforce education and development which progressive aged care providers are now addressing.

Steve Georganas, the Federal Member for Hindmarsh and Chairman of the House of Representatives Standing Committee on Health and Ageing, opened the conference, while the Rev Tim Costello AO, the CEO of World Vision Australia delivered an inspirational speech, drawing on his experiences with World Vision and some of these could apply to the aged sector.

One of the stand out presentations of the day came from Angelo Mignone, Human Resources Manager and Serge Ragno, Regional Manager with Romeo's Retail Group, which owns 25 Foodland stores. Angelo and Serge gave a very amusing overview and drew on the experiences of this highly successful family business and described why the Romeo family is widely recognised as one of South Australia's leading employers of choice.
